ACHIEVEMENTS FY05

FY 2005 brought many opportunities for the Street Department to continue to provide improvements in the quality of life for residents, visitors and neighbors of El Paso. The following highlights a few of the Street Department's accomplishments over the past year.

- Over 1,500 complaints and instances of graffiti with repair/restoration of over 8,800 individual sites were handled with almost a million (929,624 actual) square feet of graffiti cleanup
- The Paso Del Norte Bridge Temporary Pedestrian Canopy was installed in order to provide relief from El Paso's reliable sunshine. Projects for design and construction of permanent canopy structures are planned for both the Stanton and Paso Del Norte Bridges in Fiscal Year 2007.
- The Sign Replacement Project was initiated and executed, with sign replacement of 12,450 traffic control/street name signs and 1,380 sign poles funded through the 2004 bonds
- The Resurfacing Program rehabilitated/resurfaced 385,000 square yards of city streets in 2005, utilizing 2004 bond funding
