

The People who work at an Art Museum

Director -

This person oversees the daily operations of the museum and sets for the long-term goals for the museum and the art inside of it.

Curator -

This person researches the history of art and plans exhibitions with the help of the director and the rest of the staff.

Conservator -

This person cleans, protects and preserves art objects in the museum collection.

Preparator -

This person prepares art objects for display, exhibit and shipping, while making sure they are protected and lit for safe viewing.

Registrar -

This person organizes, catalogs, and maintains the records of art objects within the collection; anything that comes in or out of the museum collection is recorded.

Educator -

This person does research with the help of the curator and develops programs and material to help kids and adults understand more about art.

Docent -

This person gives tours and talks about the museum collection and exhibitions for the public.

Public Relations -

This person works with local TV or news to promote events and activities in the museum.

Development -

This person is in charge of promoting the museum, building ties within the community and fundraising.

Museum Store Manager -

This person is in charge of organizing and maintaining the museum store as an interesting part of the museum, where you can buy things.

Staff -

This group of people develops and maintains the museum offices and does the day to day business at the museum.

Operations -

This group of people maintains the building inside and outside and provides general support for the entire staff.

Visitor Service Representatives (VSR's) -

This group of people makes sure that everyone in the museum and all the art objects on display are safe and comfortable within the gallery spaces.
