The Building & Standards Commission meeting, Panel "B" was called to order by Co-Chairman, Ira Barbe at 5:37 p.m.

- V. Public hearing to determine if the property located at 105 N. Oregon Street, in the City of El Paso (legal description on file with the City Clerk) is a fire and safety hazard, and a nuisance and whether the same should be repaired or demolished. First investigated November 10, 2009. The owner Caples Land Company, LLC, 105 N. Oregon, Avenue, El Paso, Texas 79901 (the “**Owner**”), has been notified of the violations at this property.

Bill Stern, Chief Building Inspector presented the item.
Lt. Ricardo Flores, Fire Department was present to discuss the item.
Chief Victor Acosta, Fire Department was present to discuss the item.
Billy Abraham, owner, was present to discuss the item

Following presentation by staff, Commission member Paul Zacour requested to be excused from discussion, due to conflict of interest. Mr. Zacour stated that he was related to the property owner. Mr. Zacour’s recusal resulted in a lack of quorum for this agenda item.

Motion made by James M. Erickson, seconded by Fred Perez to postpone item 5 for the next regularly scheduled Building and Standards Commission Hearing, due to the lack of quorum. Motion unanimously carried.

Property owner requested he be allowed to present his case despite the postponement. Assistant City Attorney allowed property owner to respond.

Public hearing to determine if the property located at 9255 Socorro Road, in the City of El Paso (legal description on file with the City Clerk) is a fire and safety hazard, and a nuisance and whether the same should be repaired or demolished. First investigated September 21, 2009. The owner Rita L. Corral Rev Trust, 13776 Hanford Court, Victorville, CA 92394-7551 (the “**Owner**”), has been notified of the violations at this property.

- 4) That the structures be demolished within thirty (30) days; and
