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**AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION  
FOR THE SUBMISSION OF CHARTER AMENDMENTS**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO:

1. That the following amendments to the Charter of the City of El Paso shall be submitted to the qualified voters at a special election to be held on May 7, 1994.

2. Official ballots for the election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote for or against the proposed amendments with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings, and languages required by law, and with such propositions to be expressed substantially as follows:

**AMENDMENT NO. 1**

Text of Amendment

Amending the Civil Service Charter to add Section 6.13C, Civic, Convention and Tourist Center Employees, to read as follows:

Section 6.13C. CIVIC, CONVENTION AND TOURIST CENTER EMPLOYEES. As of June 1, 1994, all existing, permanent Civic, Convention and Tourist Center employees shall be admitted into classified positions in the Civil Service without examinations, probationary periods, or loss of accrued leave. The seniority date for all such employees for purposes of layoff shall be the date of admission into the classified service. Current employees going into lower compensated positions shall be protected from any loss of pay in accordance with the Civil Service Commission Rules as to Reclassification to Lower Grades.

Ballot Proposition

FOR ) Shall Section 6.13C be added to provide that the existing, permanent Civic, Convention and Tourist Center employees be admitted into Civil Service classified positions without examinations, probationary periods or loss of accrued leave; and with the date of admission into the classified

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services being the seniority date for layoff purposes;  
and protection, in accordance with Civil Service  
Rules, from loss of pay?

## AMENDMENT NO. 2

### Text of Amendment

Amending the Civil Service Charter to add Section 6.13B, City Sun Metro Lift Employees, to read as follows:

Section 6.13B. CITY SUN METRO LIFT EMPLOYEES. As of May 10, 1994, all City Sun Metro Lift Employees, currently on contract with the City, shall be admitted into classified positions in the Civil Service without examinations, probationary periods, or loss of accrued leave. The seniority date for all such employees for purposes of layoff shall be the date of admission into the classified service.

### Ballot Proposition

FOR ) Shall Section 6.13B be added to provide that the City Sun Metro Lift employees, currently under contract with the City, be admitted into Civil Service classified positions without examinations, probationary periods or loss of accrued leave; and with the date of admission into the classified services being the seniority date for layoff purposes?

## AMENDMENT NO. 3

### Text of Amendment

Amending the Civil Service Charter to amend Section 6.1-2, Appointment, and Section 6.1-5 Functions and Duties of the Civil Service Commission, to read as follows:

**Section 6.1-2. APPOINTMENT.** The Commission shall consist of nine persons appointed by the Council in consultation with the Commission, as provided in the Civil Service Rules. All members serving on the Commission when this amendment takes effect will continue to serve until their terms of office expire. The initial terms of the two additional Commissioners appointed after this amendment takes effect will expire in 1996 when other existing Commissioners' terms expire in 1996 and until the appointment of their successors. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for three year terms. Commissioners shall be limited to two successive three-year terms, regardless of the date of their original appointments, except that the initial terms of the two additional members shall not be counted in determining the two term limitation of this paragraph.

**Section 6.1-5. FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES OF THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.** The Commission shall hold regular meetings at least once a month on a day prescribed by the Rules. Special meetings shall be held as required for the proper discharge of the duties of the Commission, due notice having been given. Five members of the Commission will constitute a quorum, except as otherwise provided in the City Charter. It shall be the duty of the Commission to:

- A. Recommend to the Council:
  - 1. adoption of Rules for the administration of the Civil Service provisions of this Charter, and
  - 2. thereafter, appropriate amendments.
- B. Investigate all matters concerning the enforcement and effect of the Civil Service provisions of this Charter.
- C. Hear and determine appeals or complaints by or concerning members of the classified service.
- D. Supervise the Civil Service provisions of this Charter, ensuring fair and equitable treatment of all classified employees.
- E. Appoint hearing officers.

**Ballot Proposition**

FOR ) Shall Sections 6.1-2 and 6.1-5 be amended to provide that the Civil Service Commission shall be increased to nine members, and that a quorum of the Commission shall consist of five members?

**AMENDMENT NO. 4**

**Text of Amendment**

Amending Section 6.4-3 of the Civil Service Charter, Compensation Reduction, to read as follows:

Section 6.4-3 COMPENSATION REDUCTION. The Council has no power to reduce the pay of any City employee or group of employees, except when such reduction is necessary to equalize the pay according to the provisions of the classification and compensation plans for reasons of economy, or as provided in Article VI, Section 6.10, Section 6.11-4 and Section 6.13 of this Charter. If a pay reduction is for reasons of economy or pay equalization, it must be uniform throughout the classified service on a proportionate basis. This section does not apply to merit increases granted for limited periods of time, as further defined in the Rules.

FOR            )     Shall Section 6.4-3 be amended to provide that merit increases may be granted for limited periods of time?

**AMENDMENT NO. 5**

Text of Amendment

Amending the first paragraph of Section 6.13.11 of the Civil Service Charter (Pension Plans) to read as follows:

Section 6.13.11. PENSION PLANS

A. The Council shall continue a pension plan for all classified employees. Permanent part-time employees may elect not to participate in the City Employees' Pension Fund. Other employees of the City and employees of governmental agencies of the City, except policemen, firemen, fire alarm operators and elected officials of the City, shall have the option of belonging to the plan. Joint employees of the City and governmental agencies of the City who are current participants in any City pension plan shall continue to be included in that plan. In addition, any joint employees hired after the adoption of this Article may be included in a City pension plan to the extent their salaries are paid by the City.

Ballot Proposition

FOR            )     Shall the first paragraph of Section 6.13.11 of the Civil Service Charter (Pension Plans) be amended to specifically authorize employees of governmental agencies of the City to belong to the pension plan.

AMENDMENT NO. 6

Text of Amendment

Amending the Civil Service Charter to add Section 6.13D, Unclassified Grant Funded Positions, to read as follows:

Section 6.13D. UNCLASSIFIED GRANT FUNDED POSITIONS. As of June 1, 1994, all City employees in the unclassified service whose salaries are paid pursuant to any federal grant or aid program and who have gained current employment through examination shall be admitted into classified positions in the Civil Service without re-examination, additional probationary period, or loss of accrued leave. The seniority date for all such employees for purposes of layoff shall be the date of admission into the classified service.

Amending Section 6.2-2 of the Civil Service Charter, Unclassified Services, to delete Paragraph D which reads as follows:

Section 6.2-2. UNCLASSIFIED SERVICES. The unclassified services shall include only the following positions:

- D. Employees hired after January 15, 1977, pursuant to any federal grant or aid program, who have been or may be placed in the unclassified service by the City Council;

Amending Section 6.10-1. of the Charter, Conditions for Layoff, to delete Paragraph B which reads as follows:

Section 6.10-1. CONDITIONS FOR LAYOFF. Whenever it becomes necessary through lack of work or funds, or through the abolishment of a position or class, or for any other reason not involving delinquency on the part of the employee to reduce the number of employees in any class, the appointing authority may order a layoff. The reduction will be made in the following order:

- B. Unclassified employees hired under 6.2-2 of this Charter;

Ballot Proposition

FOR ) Shall Sections 6.13D and 6.2-2 and 6.10-1B be amended to provide that the City employees in the unclassified service whose salaries are paid pursuant

to any federal grant or aid program, who have gained employment through examination, be admitted into Civil Service classified positions without re-examination, additional probationary periods or loss of accrued leave; and with the date of admission into the classified services being the seniority date for layoff purposes; and shall unclassified services be amended to delete the provision relating to federal grant employees and shall the provision relating to layoff of unclassified grant funded employees be deleted?

### AMENDMENT NO. 7

#### Text of Amendment

Amending Section 6.5-2 of the Civil Service Charter, Rule of Three, to read as follows:

**Section 6.5-2. RULE OF THREE.** Upon receipt of a requisition to fill a vacancy, the three highest names on the proper eligible list shall be certified for one vacancy, and one additional name (the next highest) for each additional vacancy shall be certified, except in cases where a certification for incapacity or a reinstatement from layoff is being made. In cases of certification for incapacity or reinstatement from layoff, the highest name only on such list shall be certified, in accordance with procedures set forth in the Rules.

In cases where there are fewer than three names on the proper eligible list, the Personnel Director may certify names from the next lower list(s) until three names are certified.

Regular appointment may be either full-time or part-time. Conditions regarding part-time may be further defined in the Rules.

In making certification from promotional lists, however, the Personnel Director, in accordance with the Rules, may direct that those persons serving in the department in which the vacancy exists, be certified in preference to persons on the same list serving in other departments, if it appears that this would improve the efficiency of the department.

Ballot Proposition

FOR ) Shall Section 6.5-2 be amended to provide that the Personnel Director may certify names from lower eligible lists in the event that three names are not available on higher eligible lists to fill vacancies, except in cases of certification for incapacity or reinstatement from layoff?

**AMENDMENT NO. 8**

Text of Amendment

Amending Section 6.6-2 of the Civil Service Charter, Provisional Appointments, to read as follows:

**Section 6.6-2 PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENTS.** With approval of the Council, provisional appointment may be made upon receipt of a request to fill a vacancy for which fewer than three names can be certified from the proper eligible list(s). Any person so appointed must meet the minimum qualifications established for the position. Under no condition may a newly created position be filled by provisional appointment. No person may receive more than one provisional appointment in any twelve months. Provisional appointment will be effective only until a regular appointment is made from a certification list. A provisional appointment may initially be made not to exceed six months. One additional period not to exceed six months may be allowed. In no case shall a provisional appointment extend beyond twelve months from the date of the original appointment.

Ballot Proposition

FOR ) Shall section 6.6-2 be amended to provide that provisional appointments, not to exceed a total of twelve months, may be made to vacancies when fewer than three names can be certified from the appropriate eligible list?

**AMENDMENT NO. 9**

Text of Amendment

Amending the Civil Service Charter to amend Section 6.6-5 Contractors, to read as follows:

**Section 6.6-5 CONTRACTORS.** As an exception to the order of certification, contracts may be made, with approval of Council and the concurrence of the Commission, where for reasons of economy, efficiency or immediate and temporary need, it is necessary to contract with persons outside the Civil Service. The reasons shall be limited to a need for:

- A. Temporary services, in which case the contract may not exceed one year and may not be renewed or extended;
- B. Professional services;
- C. Personal services;
- D. Any other service contracts authorized in this Charter; or
- E. Where independent contracts are required as a condition of receipt of a federal or state grant or to comply with other federal or state requirements, or where a determination is made that the usage of independent contracts will increase the likelihood of either receiving or increasing the amount of federal or state funding.
- F. Where three fourths of the entire City Council determine that it would be in the best interest of the City, and three fourths of the entire Civil Service Commission determine that it would not be contrary to the fundamental principles of the City's Civil Service system for a function of the City or of a City department, section, division or unit to be performed through contract.

These contracts will be governed by the Rules adopted under this Article.

Ballot Proposition

FOR ) Shall Section 6.6-5 be amended to permit functions of the City to be performed through contract where three fourths of the entire City Council determine that it would be in the best interests of the City, and three fourths of the entire Civil Service Commission

determine that it would not be contrary to the fundamental principles of the City's Civil Service system?

AMENDMENT NO. 10

Text of Amendment

Amending the Civil Service Charter to amend Sections 6.13-2, Discharge of Permanent Employees and 6.13-3, Causes of Suspension, Reduction or Discharge, to read as follows:

Section 6.13-2 DISCHARGE OF PERMANENT EMPLOYEES. The appointing authority or the head of the department in which an employee is serving may, for any cause defined below or further defined in the Rules, discharge, suspend or reduce in rank or position any permanent employee.

Section 6.13-3. CAUSES OF SUSPENSION, REDUCTION OR DISCHARGE. The following, which may be further defined in the Rules, may constitute causes for discharge, suspension or reduction in grade of permanent employees:

- A. Conviction of a felony or of a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude;
- B. Brutality to a City prisoner;
- C. Being under the influence of intoxicants or drugs or the use thereof on duty;
- D. Being physically or mentally unfit for City service;
- E. Being wantonly offensive in conduct or language;
- F. Performance of duty consistently below established minimum standards;
- G. Negligence in care of City property;
- H. Unexcused absence from duty for a period of three or more successive days;
- I. Exerting improper use of political influence;
- J. Inducing another to commit an unlawful act;
- K. Exerting improper influence on behalf of a relative;
- L. Engaging in improper political activity;
- M. Violates the City's Ethics Ordinance;
- N. For just cause.

Ballot Proposition

FOR ) Shall Sections 6.13-2 and 6.13-3 be amended to provide that permanent City employees may be discharged, suspended or reduced in grade for just cause?

**AMENDMENT NO. 11**

Text of Amendment

Amending the Civil Service Charter to amend Section 6.1-3, Qualifications, to read as follows:

Section 6.1-3 QUALIFICATIONS. Members of the Commission must have been residents of the City at least two years immediately preceding appointment. No commissioner may hold any salaried public office or other employment compensated by the City, and no commissioner shall be directly or indirectly interested in any work, business or contract, the expense, price of consideration of which is paid from the City Treasury, or by any assessment levied by ordinance or resolution of the City Council, and any violation of this provision shall be deemed malfeasance in office and cause for removal therefrom. At least two commissioners must hold or have retired from positions other than managerial or professional. No more than three commissioners may be former city employees, and any such commissioners are not eligible for appointment until two years following separation from the City. Any commissioner may be either actively employed or retired.

Ballot Proposition

- FOR            )     Shall Section 6.1-3 be amended so that no more than two Civil Service Commissioners may be former City employees, and so that any former City employee who is appointed to the Commission must have been separated from the City at least two years at the time of appointment?

**AMENDMENT NO. 12**

Text of Amendment

Amending the Civil Service Charter to add Section 6.13E, Consolidation of Functions With Other Political Subdivisions, to read as follows:

Section 6.13E. CONSOLIDATION OF FUNCTIONS WITH OTHER POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS. If the City and any other political subdivision agree that the City will thereafter assume the responsibility for performing a governmental function which is at the time of the agreement being performed by employees of the other political subdivision, the employees of the other political subdivision who have been performing the function may be admitted into classified positions in the Civil Service without examinations, probationary periods, or loss of accrued leave. The seniority date for all such employees for purposes of layoff shall be the date of admission into the classified service. Any such employees going into lower compensated positions shall be protected from any loss of pay in accordance with the Civil Service Commission Rules as to Reclassification to Lower Grades. Any such consolidation of functions must be approved by City Council. Any question regarding the eligibility of any employee to be included in the consolidation is to be decided by the Civil Service Commission, whose decision shall be final.

Ballot Proposition

- FOR ) Shall Section 6.13E be added to provide that if the City and other political subdivisions agree to consolidate functions, the employees of the political subdivision who had been performing the functions being transferred to the City may be admitted into Civil Service classified positions without examinations, probationary periods or loss of accrued leave; and with the date of admission into the classified services being the seniority date for layoff purposes; and protection, in accordance with Civil Service Rules, from loss of pay?

**AMENDMENT NO. 13**

Text of Amendment

Amending Section 6.13-11D of the Civil Service Charter (Pension Plans) to read as follows:

- D. Firemen and Policemen Pension Fund of El Paso.

The City shall continue to augment the Firemen and Policemen Pension Fund of

El Paso in a manner consistent with the laws of Texas. To augment the Firemen and Policemen Pension Fund, the Council shall in each fiscal year beginning after February 1968, appropriate an amount equal to three times the amount paid into the fund by the participants therein; provided that the amount contributed by the City shall not exceed eighteen per cent of the total amount expended for salaries of the participants; provided further, however, that in the event age limits for participation in the pension fund, or any division of the fund, are increased as permitted by law and the raising of the age limits causes an increase in funding costs as determined by an actuary, the City shall appropriate an amount equal to such cost increase notwithstanding that such increased appropriation may exceed eighteen percent of the total amount expended for salaries of the participants, but such increased appropriation shall in no case exceed eighteen and one-half percent of the total amount expended for salaries of the participants.

Ballot Proposition

- FOR ) Shall Section 6.13-11D of the Civil Service Charter (Firemen and Policemen Pension Fund) be amended to authorize the city to appropriate amounts in excess of eighteen percent of salaries of participants to defray additional funding costs which may result from an increase in age limits for membership in the pension plan, but not to exceed eighteen and one-half percent of salaries.

**AMENDMENT NO 14**

Text of Amendment

Amending the Charter of the City of El Paso to add Section 3.20, Prohibiting the Sale of Alcoholic Beverages in Residential Sections of the City, to read as follows:

Section 3.20. Prohibiting the Sale of Alcoholic Beverages in Residential Sections of the City.  
The sale of beer and liquor is hereby prohibited in residential areas of the City.

Ballot Proposition

- FOR ) Shall Section 3.20 be added to provide that the sale of beer and liquor in residential areas be prohibited?
- AGAINST )

3. Such election shall be held at the polling places designated in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes, and said polling places shall open at 7 a.m. and remain open until 7 p.m. on the day of the election. The City Clerk of the City of El Paso shall be the clerk for early voting for said City election the Courthouse is hereby designated as the early voting station for such election. In addition, the following branch offices for early voting by personal appearance shall be authorized for such election:

- (a) Bassett Center, 6101 Gateway West
- (b) Courthouse, 500 E. San Antonio
- (c) Dieter Plaza #206, 1605 George Dieter
- (d) Northpark Mall, 9350 Dyer
- (e) Promenade Shopping, 7500 N. Mesa
- (f) Rushfair Shopping Center, 10060 Rushing
- (g) Trawood Shopping Center #D, 1810 Trawood
- (h) Kern Plaza, 3100 N. Mesa
- (i) Yarbrough Village #106, 550 Yarbrough
- (j) Lower Valley Library, 7915 San Jose Rd.,
- (k) Sacramento Senior Citizen Center, 3134 Jefferson

The early voting station shall be open from 8 a.m. through 5 p.m. on Monday through Friday, April 18, 1994 through April 22, 1994 and 8:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m. on Monday through Saturday, April 25, 1994 through April 30, 1994. The branch stations shall be open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on the same days and all stations will be open May 2-3, 1994 from 9:00 a.m. through 6:00 p.m.

4. A special canvassing board shall be appointed by the Mayor as provided by law, to count and canvass all absentee votes and ballots cast at said election.

5. Electronic voting machines shall be used for voting at the regular polling places in such election, and for the casting of absentee ballots by persons voting absentee by personal appearance and by mail.

6. Such election shall be held in the manner and form prescribed by the laws of the State of Texas, and at such election all qualified voters of the City are authorized to vote.

7. By approving and signing this ordinance, the Mayor officially confirms as his action all matters recited herein which by law come within his jurisdiction.


8. A substantial copy of this ordinance shall serve as proper notice of said election.
