Advisory Letter from the City of El Paso, Texas regarding any court interim plan  
affecting U.S. Congressional District Number 16

To the Honorable Judges of the Court:

Following the U.S. Supreme Court's decision to vacate the court-ordered interim plans for the U.S. Congressional districts in Texas, the U.S. District Court in San Antonio and the parties participating in the redistricting litigation again face the challenge of drawing interim maps for use in the 2012 election cycle that comply with the Constitution and the Voting Rights Act as well as take into account the various interests of communities in Texas.

The elected officials of the City of Paso, Texas expect that the Court and the parties will work diligently and expeditiously to draft new interim plans. In doing so, on behalf of the El Paso City Council, I strongly urge that the parties involved respect the well-defined community of interest that exists in the El Paso region, by maintaining the entire jurisdictional limits of the City of El Paso within U.S. Congressional District No. 16 and by retaining the portions of Fort Bliss that fall within the current congressional boundary.

As the westernmost part of Texas, the El Paso region shares a unique and rich culture and history that is distinct from other parts of Texas. Our community has a strong interest in remaining intact, particularly as we move forward in our continued efforts to advocate on and support the growth of Fort Bliss, an area for which the City provides essential infrastructure services. Our military post is a critical component in our efforts to spur on a robust regional economy. The Department of Defense has recently announced changes to military operations and personnel reductions, which will likely include a new round of Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC). At this critical juncture, we implore the Court and the parties refrain from fracturing Fort Bliss from the City of El Paso, which was one of its strongest advocates when Fort Bliss faced potential closure and reductions during BRAC in 2005.
