WHEREAS, in an effort to insure the continuity of the CRRMA through the avoidance of any vacancies in City-appointed positions of the CRRMA Board, the City Council desires to make appointments to Positions 2, 4 and 6, which shall become effective on February 1, 2009;



In addition, Mr. Berg has been very active in various civic and not for profit associations. He was a founder and past chair for 16 years of the Central Business Association, a downtown consortium dedicated to urban revitalization, as well as past chairman of the board of the El Paso Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, the El Paso Child Crisis Center, Las Palmas Medical Center of El Paso, and Unite El Paso - to name just a few organizations. 




