Purpose

- Streamline process for special events
- Eliminate antiquated regulations
- Have more public events
- “Do more good”
- Last Fiscal Year, 22 downtown events, 15 non-downtown events





Changes Discussed at Special City Council Meeting

Agenda Item #	What it does	What it means for Applicant	What is means for the City
6A	Waives fees for various permits that apply to special events	Saves customer from paying individual permit fees for traffic control, fencing, electrical outlets, etc.	Saves administrative costs in processing multiple permits for one event. Max loss in revenue for one event is \$1,340.
6B	Repeals the Charitable Solicitation Ordinance	Saves the customer \$48 and avoids returning to City Hall to file financial statement.	Saves administrative costs from processing and filing financial statements. Max loss in revenue of \$48 per event.
6C & 6E	Amends Noise Ordinance (Title 9) and Amplification Ordinance (Title 13)	For SPECIAL PRIVILEGE PERMITS ONLY, eliminates need for additional permit (Amplification conditions will be placed on Special Privilege permit). Saves the customer \$72 but still protects against the noise ordinance.	Provides for regulation of amplification devices (specify time periods for excessive noise, location and placement of stage, speakers, etc.) Max loss in revenue of \$72 per event.

Agenda Item #	What it does	What it means for Applicant	What it means for the City
6D & 6F	Amends Title 12 & Title 15 - Parking Meter Ordinances	Saves customer from having to pay \$8.25/meter/day for meters within footprint of event.	Saves administrative costs from identifying and bagging individual parking meters. Max loss in revenue of approx. \$1,250 for 3 day event.
6G	Amends Schedule C		Removes the fees waived above from Schedule C.
