COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT STEERING COMMITTEE QUESTIONNAIRE

*The individual meets the Bureau of Census' definition of "severely disabled." Under this definition, persons are classified as having a severe disability if they: (a) used a wheelchair or had used another special aid for 6 months or longer; (b) were unable to perform one or more functional activities or needed assistance with an Activity of Daily Living or Instrumental Activity of Daily Living; (c) were prevented from working at a job or doing housework; or (d) had a condition including autism, cerebral palsy, Alzheimer's disease, senility or mental retardation. Persons who are under 65 years of age and who are covered by Medicare or receive SSI are considered to have a disability (and a severe disability). Functional activities include seeing, hearing, having one's speech understood, lifting and carrying, walking up a flight of stairs and walking. Activities of Daily Living include getting around inside the house, getting in and out of bed or a chair, bathing, dressing, eating and toileting. Instrumental Activities of Daily Living include going outside the home, keeping track of money or bills, preparing meals, doing light housework and using the telephone.
