Background

Native American Artist. Albert is a recognized tribal potter from the Ysleta Del Sur Pueblo-Tigua Indian Reservation and has worked with clay for over seventeen years producing traditional coil, wheel thrown and contemporary ceramic pueblo style pottery.

Former Director of the Tigua Indian Cultural Center. As Director coordinated, planned and hosted educational and cultural programs for visitors to experience and learn of the traditions and tribal customs of the Ysleta Del Sur Pueblo-Tigua Indian Reservaton. Established the Tigua museum and worked with the tribal archivist.

Historical Preservation Officer of the Ysleta Del Sur Pueblo-Tigua Indian Reservation. Was responsible for coordinating, planning and hosting tribal workshops where the Tribal Elder community mentored the tribal youth. Classes allowed for the youth to learn traditional arts such as pottery, drum making, dancing, weaving, jewelry and language preservation.

Member of the Mission Trails Association. Promoted the rich history of the Ysleta, Socorro and San Elizario historic communities. Worked with representatives of all three historic communities to showcase the rich and diverse history of the Mission Valley.
