CURRENT ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS IN EL PASO, TEXAS

The Frontera Land Alliance, a local land trust dedicated to preserving the natural environment and cultural heritage of the Northern Chihuahuan Desert Region. Current (and founding) president of the Board of Directors. Member of original steering committee that established the 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation in 2004. Leads the board in conducting the affairs of the land trust: negotiating land transactions, fundraising, delivering public outreach programs, and implementing the Land Trust Alliance Standards and Practices. Frontera owns and manages Resler Canyon, a 91-acre natural arroyo within the city limits of El Paso, as the Wakeem/Teschner Nature Preserve for wildlife habitat and public enjoyment. On May 8th, 2007, Frontera entered into a conservation agreement with the City of El Paso for the preservation of Thunder Canyon, a 26-acre arroyo, in its natural state in perpetuity.

Friends of the Rio Bosque, a volunteer organization supporting Rio Bosque Wetlands Park, a 372-acre habitat restoration project owned by the City of El Paso and managed by the University of Texas at El Paso. Founding member and current treasurer. On behalf of FRB, wrote grant applications that successfully secured funding for purchase of a weather station and educational materials (from the International Boundary and Water Commission), and development of an interpretive brochure series (from the Texas Forest Service). Originated concepts, wrote text and coordinated with graphic designer in creating the nine brochures. Organizes volunteers to implement a long-term faunal monitoring program at the park.

Groundwork El Paso, a not-for-profit business working to bring about the sustained regeneration, improvement and management of the physical environment by developing community-based partnerships which empower people, businesses and organizations to promote environmental, economic and social well-being. Current member of the Board of Directors.

PREVIOUS WORK EXPERIENCE

Brooks Tropicals, Inc., Homestead, Florida, a grower/packer/importer/shipper of fresh tropical fruits and vegetables. Manager of Postharvest Technology. Conducted in-house postharvest research and collaborated with the University of Florida, USDA Agricultural Research Service and private laboratories in investigating nutritional content of fresh produce, pesticide efficacy and residue management, quarantine treatments for exclusion of invasive pests, and field and packinghouse practices to reduce physical and physiological damage to products. Served as primary company liaison with government, industry and the public for postharvest topics.
