SUBJECT:

APPROVE a resolution certifying local funding and support of the El Paso Museum of History Transportable 3-D Digital Highway project, and application to the statewide Transportation Enhancement Program for funding competition in the Texas Department of Transportation 2012 call for projects, and authorizing the City Manager to execute all necessary applications, assurances, certifications, and other documents, relative to the submission, later acceptance, and administration of such funds. The total dollar amount requested from TxDot is \$345,546. A 20% match is required by the City of El Paso. Authorization is sought for \$86,387 in matching funds.

BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION:

This proposal is one of three presented to TxDot by the El Paso Museum of History for consideration. 1) (pertaining to this resolution) Renovation of an existing 2,500 sq. ft. gallery space from a 'temporary gallery' to a 'permanent' Tourist & Welcome Center featuring four state-of-the-art transportation-related exhibits surrounding a visitor welcoming center. 2) An extension of the Tourist & Welcome Center will feature a Transportable 3-D Digital Highway (Wall). It is estimated that the Transportable Wall will remain stationary for 30-60 days before moving to the next community, including nearby Fort Bliss, the country's 2nd largest military installation housing with 97,958 troops and families. The Wall allows these families and all El Pasoans to send digital postcards and videos to loved ones overseas. It is the Museum's goal to own both a permanent and transportable digital wall that will benefit the entire region; including students, teachers, schools, colleges, universities, surrounding towns and the general public. History will come alive and be accessible to all. The Wall will store thousands of historic digital images provided by individuals and surrounding communities.

PRIOR COUNCIL ACTION:

City Council approved participation in a previous matching \$150,000 grant through IMLS for the Museum of History in 2008 for Neighborhoods & Shared Memories, a second floor temporary gallery space which was transformed into a permanent gallery. City Council later approved a \$100,000 matching grant for this same gallery. Neighborhoods and Shared Memories opened in March 2012. It is the museum's finest gallery. This same museum quality exhibit is expected for the proposed Tourist & Welcome Center.

AMOUNT AND SOURCE OF FUNDING:

\$345,546 is requested through the Texas Transportation Enhancement Program. A \$86,387, 20% match is requested from the City of El Paso.

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION TO CERTIFY LOCAL FUNDING AND SUPPORT OF THE EL PASO MUSEUM OF HISTORY TRANSPORTABLE 3-D DIGITAL HIGHWAY PROJECT AND APPLICATION TO THE STATEWIDE TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM FOR FUNDING COMPETITION IN THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRASPORATION 2012 PROGRAM CALL FOR PROJECTS

WHEREAS, the El Paso Museum of History Transportable 3-D Digital Highway project will request Texas Transportation Enhancement Program funding to design and fabricate a Transportable TouchCity 3-D Digital Highway as an external component to the Tourist & Welcome Center proposed by the Museum of History. It is estimated that the Transportable Wall will remain stationary for 30-60 days before moving to the next El Paso community, including nearby Fort Bliss, the country's 2nd largest military installation; and the City proposes to submit a nomination requesting federal funding for assistance in the amount of THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED FORTY-SIX AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$345,546); and

WHEREAS, the program requires a minimum 20% local funding match and the City has allocated and will provide the match requirement in the amount of \$86,387.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO:

THAT the City of El Paso supports funding this project as shown in the nomination budget and commits to the project's development, implementation, construction, maintenance, management, and financing. The City is willing and able to enter into an agreement with TxDOT by resolution or ordinance;

THAT the City adopts this Resolution approving the submission of the project nomination, and the support and matching funds for the project should it receive grant funds.

THAT the City Manager is hereby authorized to act on behalf of the City in all matters relating to this funding nomination and to execute all necessary applications, assurances, certifications, and other documents, relative to the submission, later acceptance, and administration of such funds.

THAT it is hereby officially found and determined that this meeting at which this resolution is passed is open to the public as required by law, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required. The regular meeting of the El Paso

Council was called to order at 8:30 a.m. on November 13, 2012 in Council Chambers by the Mayor.



6. Project Description

The El Paso Museum of History (EPMH), a City of El Paso entity, is requesting Texas Transportation Enhancement Program funding to design and fabricate a Transportable TouchCity 3-D Digital Highway (the Transportable Wall) as an external component to the Tourist & Welcome Center proposed for the EPMH. The Transportable Wall is encapsulated in a movable steel container approximately 16' long x 9' high x 9' wide for a total of 1,296 cubic feet. Wall technology and user-friendly ability can best be understood by visiting: <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Glxla0OUcYc>. This 5-minute video shows a Transportable Wall on the streets of Copenhagen. In the above video you will also get a glimpse of the Transportable Wall's container and internal workings. Note: their Transportable Wall contains 4 screens, ours will contain one. Its content is linked to a MacPro server connected to the Museum of History.

The Enhancement Program will allow the museum to integrate advanced technology created by international media giant, the Gibson Group (New Zealand). The Museum is vying to be the first institution in the world to host an internationally recognized Transportable Wall and a permanent Wall. A 3-D Digital Wall was first introduced at the Museum of Copenhagen, Denmark. Please note: more than 400,000 people visited and participated in Wall activities during its first 4-months of operation.

The EPMH Transportable Wall bilingual content will be diverse as our Borderland community. Content will not only be provided by EPMH, UTEP, EP Library, and other institutions, but one of our immediate goals is to ascertain past and present stories, photographs and videos from surrounding communities the Transportable Wall visits. Regional transportation history will be a key category within the Wall's database. It is estimated that the Transportable Wall will remain stationary for 30-60 days before moving to the next community, including nearby Fort Bliss, the country's 2nd largest military installation, housing 97,958 troops and families. The Wall allows these families to send digital postcards and videos to loved ones overseas.

Visitors will have access to the Wall's content by interacting directly with the Wall, or its content may be accessed from home or through any computer with internet access. The Museum refers to the Transportable Wall as a Digital Highway for the simple reason it provides access to any and all transportation related history as well as providing access to an unlimited number of other categories pertaining to regional history. Most importantly, the Museum brings history and modern technology directly to the people on a grander scale than any former City of El Paso project.

As El Paso experiences rapid growth and change, it is important that the region's cultural history be readily accessible to those who live in our community and to those who visit our community.

The Transportable Wall aligns with the City's goal to progress into a highly livable, sustainable, and economically robust community.* Throughout the City there are expansive biking and hiking trails, a new \$50M ballpark is under construction directly across from EPMH, new trolley car lines have been designated and several other green, quality of life enhancements are underway. El Paso is undergoing a vigorous renaissance via transportation and high-tech services. It is imperative that the project outlined in this proposal move forward.
