John L. Moses is director, Mountain Project Management, an El Paso-based consulting firm. Recently retired as General Superintendent of Texas State Parks in El Paso, he joined Texas Parks and Wildlife Department in 2000 as Park Superintendent at Hueco Tanks, following a 30-year career in international mining and petroleum.

Moses, a life-long cave explorer and conservationist, is the International Secretary of the National Speleological Society, organizing and acting as secretary of the 15th International Congress of Speleology. He also serves on the board of the non-profit Fort Stanton Cave Study Project, located near Ruidoso, NM, as their natural resource management specialist.

Locally, he chaired the Mayor's Quality of Life/ Tourism Cabinet and is a member of the Mayor's Lyceum and the El Paso County Judge's Eco-Tourism Committee. He was elected to the board of the Frontera Land Alliance in 2011, following several years on the Frontera advisory council.

He received a BS degree from the Pennsylvania State University and MBA from the University of Chicago. Commissioned as a U.S. Army officer, he served in ordnance and combat engineer units. He is a certified (Texas) emergency medical technician. Married to the former Margaret Allan, they reside on the Franklin Mountains in northeast El Paso and have 3 adult children.
