

Background

- Public Art Ordinance** adopted April 2006 provided for the establishment of the Public Art Committee and acquisition of, the funding of, and commissioning of art in municipal places
- Public Art Master Plan** adopted in April 2005 provides a frame for the City's public art program and identifies public art projects
- City Council Strategic Plan** of 2006 identifies goals related to Public Art

Public Art Program

Current Status

1. Staff the Public Art Program
2. Establish Cultural Affairs Advisory Board
3. Create the Public Art Committee
4. Utilize available funds
- 5. Initiate Public Art Plan**
6. Ownership and Maintenance
7. Establish a presence for public art in city, regional and bi-national planning
8. Explore ordinance for art in private developments

Annual Public Art Plan Components

Public Art Plan includes:

- Projects to be initiated in the current year
- Planned location
- Proposed minimum budget
- Project timeline
- Artist selection process
- In the future it will include updates on project progress

2007 Public Art Plan Development

- Reviewed the distribution of Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) around the City
- Reviewed City Council's 2006 Strategic Plan goals related to public art
- Reviewed 2005 Public Art Master Plan project recommendations
- Researched industry national trends related to public art project budgets, artist selection processes and project implementation

Report on the Nation's Public Art Programs

132 public art programs responded to a research project by Americans for the Arts. Below are the average costs of completed projects between 1997 and 2001

For Commissioned Permanent Projects

Small projects average \$27,000

Large projects average \$345,160

Purchase of Existing Artwork

Small projects average \$8,835

Large projects average \$41,055

Public art projects may be an integral part of a structure, attached to a structure or detached from the structure within or outside of it. It may also be located on municipal grounds where there are not structures.

Methods of Selecting Artists for Public Art Projects


There are several methods for selecting art and artists:

- Open Competition
- Limited or Invitational Competition
- Direct Selection
- Mixed Process
- Pre-Qualified Artists List

Any of the following methods may be used, depending upon the requirements of a particular project which may include but are not limited to: budget, timeline, geographic location, and scope of work

Pre-Qualified Artists List

The list will be updated every two years and will include categories for established as well as emerging artists. The list will include local, regional and national artists. Artists interested in being considered for projects will be invited to submit their qualifications and PAC will review and select Artists



2007 Public Art Plan Implementation Process

- Work with the Public Art Committee and Cultural Affairs Advisory Board to issue a call to Artists and prioritize projects
- Work with stakeholders to develop a scope of service for each project that defines interests, needs and types of projects to consider
- Issue request for proposals to the pre-qualified list of Artist
- Artist/project selection
- Project implementation

- City Council review and approval
- Develop PAC operating procedures
- Issue call to Artists
- Begin project development
