VITA

Jim retired from the US Army in 1985 as a major general after 31 years of service: ten years in command positions at platoon, battery, battalion, brigade and Fort Bliss; ten years with the Army Staff in the Pentagon; and eleven years in other staff assignments and schools. He served overseas in Korea, Germany and South Vietnam. His final Army assignment was as commander of the US Army Air Defense Center and School at Fort Bliss, Texas, and Chief of Air Defense Artillery.

From 1985 to 1989 he was a vice president of the El Paso Electric Company. In 1990 and 1991 he was a defense consultant. From December 1991 until December 1998 he was the manager of Raytheon Company's El Paso Operation. He operated the Blythe Ranch, a family cattle operation near Chaparral, New Mexico, from 1999 to 2003.

He is a member of the Texas Military Preparedness Commission, appointed by Governor Perry. He is a founding investor and member of the board of directors of United Bank of El Paso Del Norte.
